| Project Brief

Willmott Dixon's team of car park superstructure experts were appointed by Winchester City Council for the design and construction of a 287 space multi-storey car park on the site of the old Vaultex warehouse facility, adjacent to Bar End Road Park & Ride.

The structure includes 800m² of roof-mounted solar panels, generating enough power to charge the 16 Electric Vehicle (EV) charging points as well as the lighting, lifts, CCTV and other electrical systems in the building. Further EV charge points can be added as demand grows, further underscoring the Council's commitment to encouraging alternatively-fuelled and low-carbon modes of transport.

The project has been delivered by Winchester City Council in partnership with Willmott Dixon and Enterprise M3 Local Enterprise Partnership (EM3 LEP) who has provided £5.65m of grant funding.
