Investing in skills to create growth

It is essential we link to Kent's local strategy for promoting economic growth, building a 'place' of prosperity and supporting productivity.

One example is the drylining academy we opened in 2019 inside HMP Elmley to help prison residents find work on release back into the community. This is important as the construction industry needs to fill 168,000 jobs over the next three years, according to the CITB.

Willmott Dixon aims to be a catalyst for even more opportunity for the people of Kent and I and the team look forward to working with partners in the county for many decades to come.

Shaping Kent's future

From leisure centres to university campuses to prison academies, our work is helping to transform lives throughout the community.



1 Benenden Hospital, Cranbrook

We delivered improvements and a large expansion to this private hospital, including new theatres, en-suite rooms, an ophthalmic suite, outpatient department, procedure rooms and a new entrance, atrium and car parks.



5 Fairfield Leisure Centre, Dartford

By undertaking extensive asbestos removal, refit and new build work, we were able to turn a tired 1970s-era leisure centre into a super-modern public facility, adding another 30-50 years to its lifespan.



2 The Skinners' Kent Academy, Tunbridge Wells

Celebrating the school's specialism of science and engineering, the three-storey building has four zones that provide a variety of personalised learning spaces.



6 H Wing, HMP Swaleside, Eastchurch

This project involved construction of a new wing that could house 180 cells with a new link walkway. We also undertook phased works to various existing ancillary buildings.



3 Weald of Kent Grammar School

This building created space for 450 11-16-year-old pupils and a 180-student sixth form on a site in Sevenoaks. The building was constructed next to Trinity Free School, which we also built a year before.



7 Drylining Academy, HMP Elmley

The Willmott Dixon Building Lives Drylining Academy provides inmates with drylining skills and a CSCS card. We converted a warehouse inside the prison, and also equipped prison officers with accredited skills.



4 Bradbourne Car Park, Sevenoaks

This is not your average car park! Bradbourne possesses stunning detail in the form of coloured aluminium fins and green walls. Replacing a surface car park, its 436 spaces meet Park Mark's Safer Car Park scheme.



8 Sibson Building, University of Kent

Working in a busy, live environment, we created an 8,000m² hub that brings together academics, students and administrative staff. State-of-the-art facilities include seminar rooms, lecture theatres, atrium and 150 offices.




9 Kennedy Building, University of Kent

This three-storey building brings the whole of the School of Economics together under one roof. The project features an array of photovoltaic panels to reduce the reliance on energy from the national grid.



10 Dover Christ Church Academy

We modernised and extended the academy's home, adding science laboratories and specialist teaching spaces for hair, beauty, textiles and catering. We also extended the existing sports hall.
