



WCC wished to single source the work due to both the great work our team have done delivering throughout CV19 on their £37m Sport & Leisure Centre and their need to quickly appoint an OJEU-compliant contractor to support their application for Local Enterprise Partnership (LSP) funding.

We are now finalising price and forming contract to start on site 18/05/21 and still deliver the pre-31/01/22 funding completion requirement.
